## **(Inter)subjectivity in language and discourse: synchronic and diachronic aspects**

The expression of (inter)subjectivity across numerous languages and discourses is one of the most widely explored areas from both synchronic and diachronic perspectives (Traugott, Dasher 2002; Marín-Arrese 2011, 2015, 2017; Baumgarten et al. 2012; Vis et al. 2012; Carretero, Domínguez Romero 2024, among others). In Lithuanian linguistic research, (inter)subjectivity has been primarily examined through the lens of modality, evidentiality, and stance across various discourse types, including fiction (Usonienė & Šolienė 2010), academic discourse (Šinkūnienė 2012), journalistic discourse (Ruskan 2017), political discourse (Ruskan & Šolienė 2023), and Old Lithuanian writings (Jasionytė-Mikučionienė 2015, 2016). However, there are still gaps in how (inter)subjectivity is encoded across languages through a range of lexical and grammatical means, how authorial and non-authorial (inter)subjectivity are realised in discourse, and what developmental paths different markers of (inter)subjectivity have undergone. We therefore invite contributions to this workshop that address the expression of (inter)subjectivity across a variety of genres, languages, and discourses, including, but not limited to, the following:

- realizations of (inter)subjectivity (lexical, grammatical, discursive);
- content of (inter)subjectivity (modality, evidentiality, evaluation, affect);
- the source of (inter)subjectivity (authorial, non-authorial);
- (inter)subjectivity in different types of discourse;
- diachronic aspects of (inter)subjectivity.
